I do not consent to my child receiving instruction or information on or being subjected to discussions about gender identity ideology in the classroom, including but not limited to transgenderism, gender identity, gender spectrum, gender dysphoria, alternate gender pronouns, pronoun preferences, clothes changing closets, puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, gender reassignment surgery ("top" or "bottom" surgery), or similar related subject matter.

This also includes exposure to or participation in any surveys, digital or physical instructional materials, internet websites, social media, chat rooms or similar digital platforms, curricula, writing prompts, videos, clubs, small groups, classroom lunch discussions or any similar materials or gatherings related to any topics listed above.
